ISBN: 978-0-473-16878-0 The Jack Adamson Collection, a rare and unique collection of glass plate photographs (1889-1901), has been sumptuously reproduced in this publication. Adamson captured some of the pivotal moments in the history of earlier New Zealand mountaineering. His photographs include wonderful character studies, beautiful topographical views and his work contains a surprising array of emotion — the everyday, the humorous and moments of spontaneity that were rare for this period of photography. The author, who received a Canterbury Community Historian grant in 2007, and unravels some of the complicated twists and turns of Adamson's story. Collectively they were the founders of the town but their story has not previously been recorded in any great detail.
