*This is a native New Zealand frog called the Archey's frog (*Leiopelma archeyi*). It is the smallest of the indigenous species. They are only found in two regions on the North Island of New Zealand.*

*They like to live at a relatively high altitude in moist native forest. They are terrestrial and nocturnal, spending most of the day hidden under stones or logs away from streams or creeks. The Archey's frog is a terrestrial breeder, laying a small clutch of eggs in a moist site under stones or logs.*

*The small tailed froglets remain on their father's back for several weeks until metamorphosis – the change to adult frog – is nearly complete.*
