South Canterbury's Strathallan Immigrants, by Alan McKenzie.</p> <p>On the 14th January 1859 when this group of about 111 men, women and children arrived on the ship Strathallan and stepped onto the shingle beach one of their number recorded there were four or five houses in Timaru. They had been encouraged to travel 12,000 miles from the other side of the world on one of the longest sea voyages ever undertaken by immigrants to start a new life in the settlement with the name of Timaru. They were collectively the founders of the town but, because they were working class people who lived ordinary lives, their story has not previously been recorded in any great detail. <p>The Lifesaving Rockets of Timaru (2nd edition), by D J Batchelor.</p> <p>Explores the origins and use of the spectacular Boxer "rocket apparatus" by the Timaru Volunteer Rocket Brigade. The Brigade's members were involved in rescues at most of the nineteenth century wrecks off Timaru and are credited with rescuing at least one hundred people from vessels in distress. Additionally one booklet, Messages in Stone, explores some of the symbolism present in the monuments and headstones present in the cemetery.
