Elizabeth Cullimore remembered the air raid shelters from her school days during World War Two. She said there was a “little bag to put around our necks with our names, a cork, but no memory of the chewing gum that was supposed to be there. The smell of damp clay can still take me right back to

that first memory of the dank dark air raid shelter at the rear of our Primer Block at Timaru Main.”

There was also cotton wool to protect their ears. Attached to their clothing was the small, plain luggage tag with their name and address to identify them if needed.

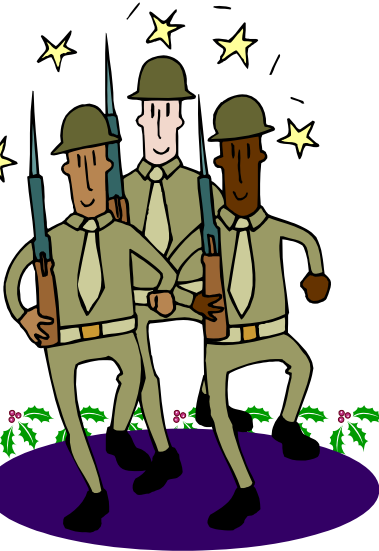


# Christmas Parade

We hope to have a float in the Christmas Parade on the 5th December to help advertise our latest exhibition "Back' Em Up".

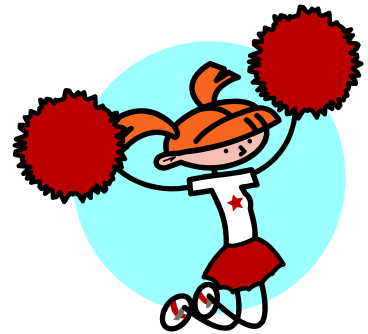

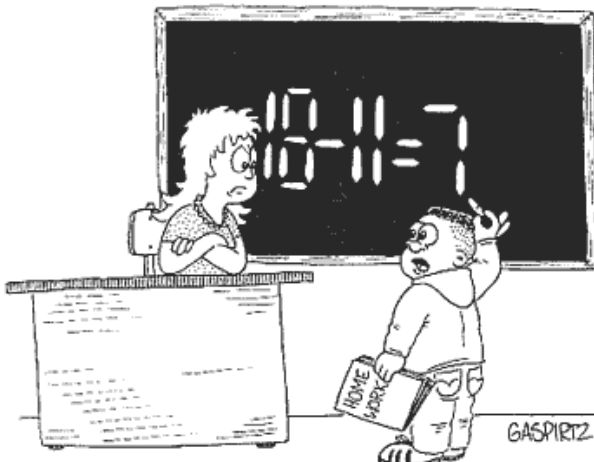


Scientists have found water on the Moon!
