Under Clause 8 of the First Schedule to the Resource Management Act 1991, the following persons may make a further submission:

- Any person representing a relevant aspect of public interest;
- Any person that has an interest in proposed Plan Change 22 greater than the interest the general public has; and
- Timaru District Council.

A copy of the further submission must be served on the person who made the submission to which the further submission relates, within five working days of making the further submission to Timaru District Council.

The closing date for further submissions is 5pm Thursday 16 July 2020.
