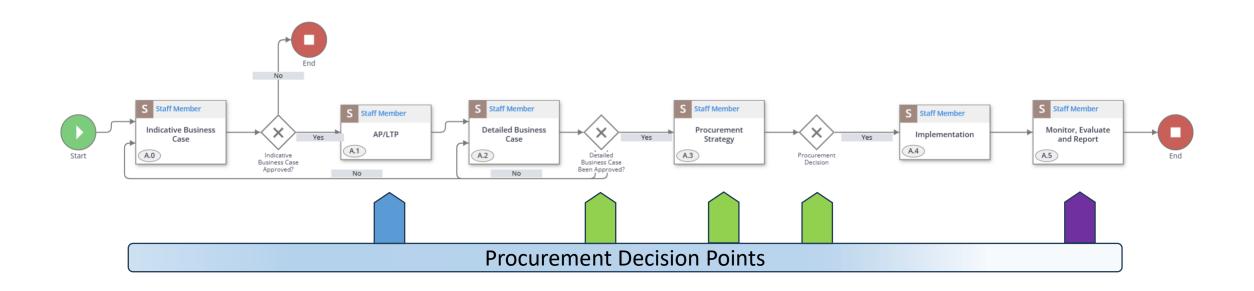

Procurement Process Overview - Recommendation

Expenditure Type	Procurement Strategy	Formal Contract Type	Evaluation Model	Outcome Focus
Minor Up to \$20,000	Closed procurement process Deal exclusively with local suppliers (if requirements are available locally)	Purchase Order	Lowest Price Conforming	Local Value
Moderate \$20,001 to \$100,000	Open procurement process Local suppliers preferred if price is within 5% of the most competitive price	Short Form Agreement or CCCS Contract	Lowest Price Conforming	Local Value / Public Value
High \$100,001 plus	Open procurement process Evaluation criteria <u>must</u> include a Weighted Attribute addressing local benefit / broader outcomes	NZS3910 / 3916 / 3917	Weighted Attributes	Public Value

Standard Evaluation Criteria – Weighted Attribute - Examples

Capability & Capacity

Size, structure and type of organisation
Financial soundness, annual turnover.

Demonstrate clear understanding of the requirements

Track Record

Provide examples of similar or relevant completed projects successfully delivered

Evidence of quality awards, industry recognition.

Relevant Skills

Experienced project team with the specialist technical resources and expertise, with strong linkages to the nominated track record contracts.

C.V.'s generally required

Methodology

Detail how you plan to deliver against milestones

Identify and provide mitigation for key risks

Identify options for beneficial practices

Broader Outcomes

Indications of internal practises that contribute to enhancing the environment, reducing emissions & waste

Evidence of previously achieving positive socially responsible outcomes

Use of local resources

Explain how you will maximise the use of local materials and resources and the community benefits that your approach and methodology will bring to the project

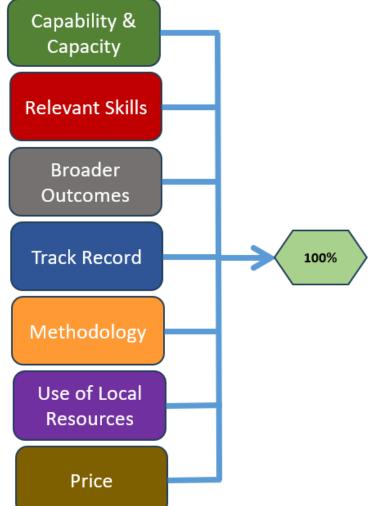

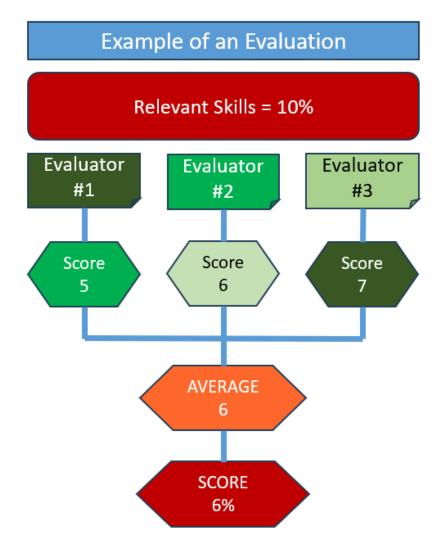

Evaluation Scoring Scale – Brooks Law



Rating	Score	
EXCELLENT Significantly exceeds the criterion	9-10	
GOOD Exceeds the criterion in some respects	7-8	
ACCEPTABLE Meets the criterion in full, but at a minimal level	5-6	
MINOR RESERVATIONS Marginally deficient	3-4	
SERIOUS RESERVATIONS Significant issues that need to be addressed	1-2	
UNACCEPTABLE Significant issues not capable of being resolved	0
