	engagement from all participants. Our puppetry workshop at Winchester Rural School was a stand out for us. The size of the grant would have made it an uneconomic tour – but scheduling the Timaru tour alongside one to Christchurch made things feasible. We were able to get the large cost of the ferry tickets (\$770) covered by a Christchurch CCS grant, which is why this expense does not appear on the above budget.

250 children from the wider Timaru educational community got to have a tactile experience with our unique collection of Rock-art puppets. All participants will have gained a greater awareness of, and appreciation for our amazing South Canterbury Maori rock-art heritage.

The 30 children who participated in the puppetry workshop also learnt basic puppeteering techniques and applied them in telling their own creative stories, using our collection of Rock-art puppets.



During this term we consistently experience a lull in our class attendance presumably due to the cold weather and the sickness that often accompanies it. However this term through promotion in our antenatal classes, at events etc. we have seen a much more consistent attendance. We will continue with this strategy going forward.
