● Aerosol cans	● Dog poo (bagged)	● Meat trays with a number 1 plastic triangle (rinsed)
● Aluminium foil (Try the scrunch test: if you scrunch the foil in your hand and it stays crunched up, it is aluminium)	● Drinking glasses (broken)	● Milk bottles with a number 2 plastic triangle (no lids)
● Ashes (cooled for 7 days)	● Egg cartons and trays (clean, dry)	● Mirrors (if broken)
● Batteries – all	● Electrical appliances	● Newspaper and office paper
● Biodegradable plastic	● Empty engine oil containers	● Oils, e.g. mineral, used engine, gearbox and transmission oil
● Books	● Fast food packaging/containers (except cardboard and paper)	● Paint and chemicals
● Bread, pastries and flour	● Food scraps, fruit and vegetables (including pips)	● Fish and chip paper, paper towels and serviettes (remove any plastic)
● Bubble wrap	● Food tins (rinsed)	● Plastic bags, e.g. vegetable bags, bread bags, food bags
● Cans (clean)	● Furniture	● Plastic bottles/containers – grades 3, 4, 6, 7 or no grade
● Car parts and scrap metal	Garden – Bamboo, cabbage tree leaves, rhubarb leaves, flax and palm leaves	● Plastic bottles/containers numbered 1, 2 or 5 (clean, no lids)
● Car seats	● Garden waste, most cut flowers, pruned branches, leaves and grass clippings (unsprayed)	● Plastic film or wrap – soft plastic
● Cardboard boxes (clean and flattened)	● Garden pots	● Plastic ties and strapping
● Cartons – milk and juice	● Glass bottles (rinsed, no lids)	● Polystyrene, including packaging polystyrene
● Cat litter	● Glass cookware/ovenware (broken)	● Sanitary items
● CDs or DVDs	● Glass jars (rinsed, no lids)	● Shells and shellfish
● Cellphones and smartphones	● Hoses and plastic tubing	● Shredded paper (coloured glossy paper goes in the red bin)
● Cereal boxes (clean and flattened)	● Household appliances	● Smoke alarms (with batteries removed)
● Cereal liners	● Human and animal hair	● String, twine, rope
● Cheese and butter	● Junk mail	● Takeaway cups
● Clothing, shoes and textiles. Drop off to a clothing bin or charity if it's reusable	● Leftover meat, fish and bones	● Toys
● Coffee grinds and tea bags	● Lids – plastic and metal bottle/container lids	● Window glass (broken)
● Coffee pods and sachets	● Light bulbs – Fluorescent	● Wood – treated, stained, oiled or painted
● Computers and electronic devices	● Light bulbs – Tungsten and LED	
● Crockery, ceramics, porcelain (broken)	● Magazines	
● Disposable nappies	● Meat trays – polystyrene	
● Dog poo (wrapped in paper)
