MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

It has been a busy few months at the council as we work out plan of work for the next decade, then present it all for everyone to have their say.

The long term plan we're currently preparing outlines over half a billion dollars of infrastructure and service investment over the next decade. I'd like to take the opportunity to give you some insight into this spending.

People often say that council's should stick to 'core services' of water, waste and roads, and indeed the majority of council spending covers those. About 66c of every dollar you pay council supports three activities.

Roading is the most visible service, and probably the one that comes under the most scrutiny, but we can't ignore all the invisible services just because we can't see them.

Every bit of infrastructure has a finite life no matter how well it's maintained, and why we're undertaking upgrades of pre-war assets such as the Pareora Pipeline and the Downlands rural water scheme.

Timaru District has always taken an approach of steady and planned investment in these areas, which has laid a strong foundation for our robust local economy. We're now seeing the results of underinvestment in other areas coming to roost.

We could have the best infrastructure in the world, but it would be worth nothing if no-one wants to live here. We also need to invest in our cultural facilities such as sport, heritage and culture.

The 'nice to have' facilities such as parks, libraries, galleries, swimming pools and theatres are what helps bring districts to life.

They are what attracts and keeps people in a district, so our businesses can continue to grow, and can act as commercial catalysts for regeneration of areas.

Getting this balance right, while keeping things as affordable as possible, is key to putting together a successful Long Term Plan. We hope what we present to you next month will show a positive vision for the district which see us thriving together.

The consultation document will be in the courier on 8 April or online at thrivingtogether.co.nz. Councillors will also be at a series of events through the consultation period, and would love to hear from you in person. So please, make sure you have your say.

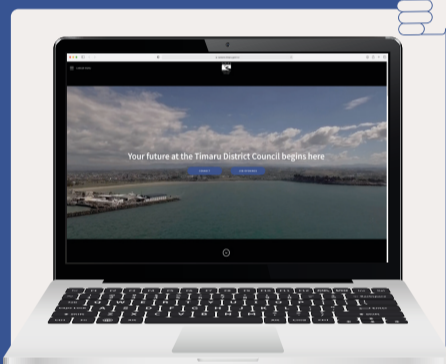
