JOINT INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS FOR BUTLER STREET

A series of coordinated works to renew water and road infrastructure on Butler Street, Timaru will begin in the first week of August

The water and wastewater systems, and the kerb and channel on Butler Street will be renewed, immediately followed by resurfacing of Butler Street in asphalt and some street tree replacements.

The series upgrades will take approximately four months to complete.

Council Group Manager Infrastructure Andrew Dixon said that coordinating the works reduced the overall disruption for property owners, businesses and road users, and enabled the teams to work more efficiently

"In cases like this where several systems in one place require upgrading, it makes sense that we coordinate works to reduce the level of disruption caused over time," he said

"Our contractors will be working hard to complete the upgrades over the next several months, and long term this will ensure we can continue to supply high-

We're renewing the wastewaster and water systems and the kerb and channel on Butler Street (including upgrading vehicle and pedestrian crossings). Following this we're also resurfacing Butler Street in asphalt and making some landscaping improvements. When?

Works are estimated to commence in early August 2021 with an approximate duration of 4 months.

New dogs need to be registered separately by visiting a Council office or service centre.

infrastructure and well as impeding vehicle access. The current trees will be removed and varieties more suited to the environment will be planted.' Water and wastewater system renewal works will kick

off first at the Arthur Street end of Butler Street, with kerb and channel works to follow.

Road users can expect some delays to travel through Butler Street and a reduction in on-street parking during works.

"Traffic management will be in place to protect the safety of pedestrians and road users. We ask the public to take extra care when passing through the site and follow all traffic signals and signs provided by staff," said Andrew.

Alternative on street parking is available on Arthur, North, Bank and Latter Streets.

It will be an offence under the above Regulations for any person otherwise than under authority of an authorised period to use the street for ordinary vehicular traffic during the period of closure.

- What happens if I don't register my dog? • You will have to pay your dog registration fee plus an additional late payment fee.
- When an unregistered dog is found the owner can be liable for a \$300 infringement.
- The dog can be seized and impounded.
- Selected Dog Owner Status

There is a one off fee of \$40,00 for those who wish to apply for Selected Dog Owner Status, following a successful application those with Selected Dog Owner Status will be eligible to have their registration fee discounted to \$36.00
