4. South Canterbury Spaces and Places Strategy – Final Adoption

The Parks and Recreation Manager spoke to his report presenting the final draft of the South Canterbury Spaces and Places Strategy for adoption. The Strategy is the same as that adopted in principle at the Community Development Committee meeting on 24 July 2018, except for Recommendation 13 under Sector-Wide (and Resourcing Strategy Implementation), with the addition of 'Local authorities improve the visibility and accessibility of facilities by utilising and sharing facility data collected with the community and visitors via appropriate media and digital platforms.' The Strategy has been adopted by Mackenzie District Council and will be used by the Waimate District Council for planning purposes.

The Committee noted there are recommendations for the creation of two roles to implement the strategy; an Activator and a Navigator. Adoption of the Strategy does not imply that there is any financial commitment by Council.

Le Quesnoy New Zealand Memorial Museum – Consideration of Financial Support

The Committee considered a report by the Customer Services Manager providing further background for consideration of a donation from Council to the Le Quesnoy New Zealand Memorial Museum. Grant Finlayson, South Canterbury representative for the Museum's Trust, spoke to a PowerPoint presentation on the proposed museum. This is a one off national project focusing on educating Europeans and New Zealanders about the sacrifices New Zealand made in WW1 and WW2. Most New Zealand soldiers that were killed in action died in Europe. Le Quesnoy has a special relationship with New Zealand as it was liberated by New Zealand soldiers in WW1 with no loss of civilian lives. The museum will become a database of information about WW1 and WW2, and it is hoped it will become a centre for overseas tourists to visit.



The Le Quesnoy museum project is estimated to cost \$15 million with \$5 million for the purchase of land and property, \$5 million for tourist and staff accommodation and \$5 million for the museum's fit out.

There are four other war memorial museums in France which were funded by their governments. No financial assistance has come from the New Zealand government except for possible tax benefits for this project. The Trust is approaching all New Zealand Councils for funding.

The Committee discussed the value to the Timaru District of investing in the museum project, noting its importance and connection to New Zealand.

The Committee was supportive of the project and wished to make a contribution, however the Economic Development Fund was not deemed an appropriate fund for the project and other funds were discussed. The project does not fit the Grants and Loans Policy. The Contingency Fund was deemed appropriate.
