The proposal to remove drinking water, waste water and stormwater from direct council control, and group it into a single organisation covering most of the South Island, is currently out for feedback to local government.

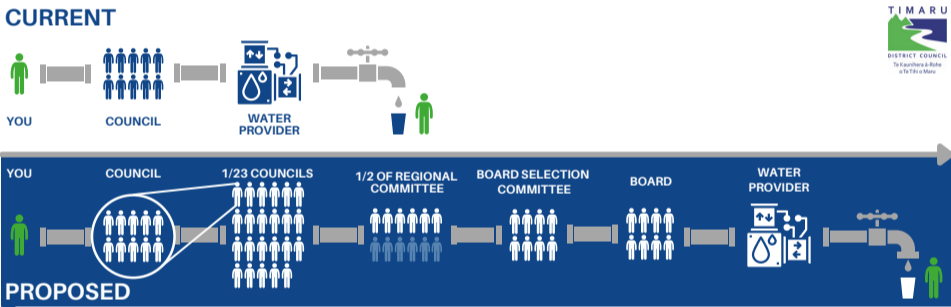
