I wish to state for the record that my submission #124 still stands and I strongly oppose this building being included on the Heritage register for the reasons previously noted:-

Gray, P [124.1] seek the removal of HHI-79 Hampton House as they have consent to demolish the property, due to legislation concerning tenants, healthy homes and seismic strengthening having made the property financially unviable.

In addition to the above, Council rates have added significantly to the burden.

As noted we have a consent to demolish this property and will proceed with this course of action prior to the consent expiring so it is pointless to add the property to the Heritage Register.

As Dr. McEwan and Andrew McLennan believe the property has some Heritage Value I would like to propose an alternative that the Timaru District Council could purchase Hampton House for the benefit of the people of Timaru.
