

Bridge PR014 (which crosses Otipua Creek just south of School Park) is being replaced. Site works will commence approx. 16 April 2021 with an expected duration of 6 weeks.

#### Tell us what you think

Environment Canterbury's draft Long-Term Plan asks whether you support MyWay by Metro on-demand public transport in Timaru.

#### Option 1: Keep MyWay by Metro

- As with all public transport, this would be funded through a targeted rate for Timaru ratepayers and from government grants. It would add about \$14 per \$100,000 of property value, per year.
- The targeted rate does not apply to ratepayers outside of the Timaru urban area, such as Pleasant Point, Temuka and

#### Option 2: MyWay would not continue beyond the trial

> We would look at adjusting, and potentially reducing, the fixed route bus system so that it is financially viable.

We are also interested in whether you would like to see this type of on-demand public transport trialled in other communities in the future.
