Introduction

1. Timaru District Council is a regulated supplier, within the meaning of section 57D of the Commerce Act 1986, in respect of the water supply services and wastewater services that it provides. Council makes decisions about capital and operating expenditure and about the level of charges and revenue recovery for those services.
2. This document is a combined disclosure made under clause 2.6 of the Water Services Information Disclosure Determination 2026 [2026] NZCC 3, as amended by the Water Services Information Disclosure (Minor Amendments) Amendment Determination 2026 [2026] NZCC 26 (the Determination). Each part of this document identifies the requirement of the Determination to which it relates, as set out below.

3. The quantitative charges information in Part 3 is also disclosed in tabular form in the accompanying Microsoft Excel workbook, in accordance with clause 2.5(3)(b). Part 3 reproduces every row of the Charges sheet of the workbook, and each row in Part 3 is cross-referenced to its workbook row number so that the two can be reconciled.
4. Amounts in Part 3 are stated inclusive of GST. Clause 1.9 of the Determination requires amounts to be exclusive of GST unless otherwise specified, and clause 4.9(2)(f) and (g) specify that the amount or rate of a charge, and the part of a charge allocated to a regulated service, are to be stated inclusive of GST.
5. The information in Part 2 and Part 3 is disclosed at the single service level, as required by clauses 4.7(6) and 4.8(2). Council is a single territorial authority and is not a water organisation owned by two or more owners, so clause 2.4 (disclosure for each district) does not apply. In any event, clause 2.4(3)(b)(iv) excludes information disclosed under clauses 4.8 to 4.10 from that requirement.
6. Council will disclose any new or changed amount referred to in clause 4.9 or 4.10 within 10 working days of the date on which the new amount or the change is approved, as required by clause 4.8(3). Council will disclose any new or amended dividends policy or growth funding policy within 10 working days of adoption or amendment, as required by clauses 4.6(2) and 4.7(7).

Part 1 — Dividends policy (clause 4.6)

7. Timaru District Council is a territorial authority water services provider and therefore does not and cannot pay dividends. This statement is made under clause 4.6(1)(c) of the Determination.

Part 2 — Policy for funding growth (clause 4.7)

8. Timaru District Council implements a suite of policies, along with fees and charges, for funding growth.

Explanation of Council's approach to funding growth (clause 4.7(2)(a))

9. Council provides water supply and wastewater services, and recovers the growth charge for changes in demand for these services through, as appropriate:
 - a. Financial contributions
 - b. Development agreements or vested asset arrangements
 - c. Connection charges
10. Council has adopted an approach where growth largely pays for growth through one of the three identified funding methods. Capital costs not able to be recovered through one of these funding methods would likely be debt funded.¹
11. Administrative costs in processing applications to connect to the water supply or wastewater network are recovered through Infrastructure Group Administration Fees.
12. Council does not use development contributions, or IFF levies.

The reasons for this approach (clause 4.7(2)(b))

13. The reason for this approach is the exacerbator principle,² and the low levels of growth the Council has, which often can be managed within the existing levels of service.³ This is demonstrated by Council's approach where a connection charge is generally sufficient to account for increased service demand, allowing financial contributions or negotiated arrangements to manage more bespoke growth impacts on the networks.
14. Growth is therefore substantially self-funded. Where a project is attributed to growth as well as renewal or an improvement to the level of service, it is at least partially funded by connection charges or growth charges, or both, with the balance funded from rates or debt.

The charges and obligations relating to a new connection or other type of growth, and the circumstances in which they are imposed (clause 4.7(3)(a) and (b))

15. As noted above, these are financial contributions, development agreements or vested assets, and connection charges. These are recovered at the time a person seeks to connect to the water supply or wastewater network. This is a services consent, which is typically progressed through a resource consent or a building consent application. The connection charges and growth charges that may be payable are disclosed in Part 3 of this document.
16. Council does not use development contributions, so clause 4.7(4) does not apply.

Part 3 — Information about charges and IFF levies (clauses 4.8 to 4.10)

18. The following tables disclose the information required by clause 4.9 of the Determination for each charge payable to Council for the provision of its water supply services and wastewater services. The information is disclosed separately for each regulated service, at the single service level, as required by clause 4.8(2). Charges are grouped under the categories set out in clause 4.9(1), and each table sets out the matters required by clause 4.9(2)(b) to (i). Amounts are stated inclusive of GST.⁵
19. The Row column of each table gives the row number of the corresponding row in the Charges sheet of the accompanying workbook. Every row of that sheet is reproduced, and the regulated service, category, property use, amount and attributable amount in each table match the workbook.
20. Where a charge is not directly attributable to the provision of a regulated service, the part of the charge allocated to that service is stated in accordance with clause 4.9(2)(g), using the approach and methodology that Council discloses under clause 5.25.

Charges not disclosed

21. Council does not use development contributions. Development contributions are in any event excluded from the definition of charge in clause 1.6 of the Determination, and clause 4.7(4) does not apply to Council.
22. Council levies fees for the occupation of the road reserve and applies staff charge-out rates for the recovery of staff time. These amounts are not disclosed as charges under clause 4.9 because they are not payable for the provision of a regulated service.

Information about IFF levies (clause 4.10)

23. Council does not collect any IFF levy on behalf of a responsible SPV, within the meaning of section 7(1) of the Infrastructure Funding and Financing Act 2020. Clause 4.10 of the Determination therefore does not presently apply to Council.

Part 4 — Minor aspect supplier (clause 4.11)

24. Council provides a minor aspect of a water service, within the meaning of section 219 of the Local Government (Water Services) Act 2025, at the Rangitata Huts water supply. That supply is not connected to a network provided by a water service provider other than Council.
25. The reasons for that position, and a description of the water services that Council provides at that location, are set out below.⁶
