To whom it may concern

This is a note to confirm the support of “Our Waitarakao” to the Waitarakao Washdyke Seadown Drain Realignment Project. Endorsement for this support letter was made by the Our Waitarakao Implementation Group during its 26 March 2026 meeting.

Our Waitarakao is a partnership between Environment Canterbury, Te Rununga o Arowhenua, Department of Conservation and Timaru District Council. It involved the creation of a catchment wide strategy for the Waitarakao Washdyke Lagoon catchment, and we are now around 18 months into implementation of that strategy.

When developing the Waitarakao Washdyke Lagoon Catchment Strategy alongside the community, the Our Waitarakao project partners had a strong awareness of the need for this coastal realignment project to occur.

For this reason, our catchment strategy was written and extensively consulted with the public in such a way as to pre-suggest support to a future realignment project and the types of adaptations and outcomes that project should (and now has) proposed.

Elements of the realignment consent application contribute toward each of the outcomes sought in the Waitarakao Washdyke Catchment Strategy. Most notably, the ecological enhancement incorporated into the realignment consent supports Outcomes 1 and 2 relating to ecological revitalisation and mahika kai respectively. Further the protection of the Seadown Drain and industry from natural hazards reflects key objectives within Outcome 3 around resilience planning. Outcomes 4 and 5 of the strategy relate to community access to the catchment and community involvement in the mahi we do. We anticipate opportunities to bring the community into some of the environmental enhancement aspects of this realignment project for everyone’s benefit.

We also envision there is potential for Our Waitarakao to collaborate during the realignment project’s construction and post-construction phases:

- Our Waitarakao has connected with a combination of landowners, community volunteers, industry partners and external funders to support activities such as planting, plant and weed maintenance, pest control, etc. We believe our experiences can help deliver on the environmental enhancement elements of this consent in a cost-effective, and beneficial way.

- Our Waitarakao engages with the community to seek partnership opportunities with external funders, industry and others. During the natural course of this mahi we may find ways additional ways to support environmental enhancement aspects of this realignment project.
- During the construction phase of the realignment, it is expected environmental enhancement will originate from the budget/planning of the realignment project. There is an opportunity that post-construction, the management/maintenance of the enhancement work, could be run more directly through the Our Waitarakao partnership and its implementation group. This could help ensure long-term protection of environmental gains made.
- Our Waitarakao supports the environmental enhancement gains proposed in the consent. We also recognise there is additional land and other great opportunities to do even more in future years. Consideration for further, enhancement work that builds on, and is enabled by, what is undertaken in the project's construction phase, is likely to be a part of Our Waitarakao project future.

The support and collaborative interest of Our Waitarakao is subject to the ongoing support of our project within the four project partners. The catchment strategy is written to be a perpetual document, and implementation is funded through to at least June 2027. A strong bid for ongoing support for the project will be made for the financial years beyond this, and we also regularly seek external funding opportunities. While we have great confidence in the project's continuation, we must acknowledge the general uncertainty currently existing in the local government space.

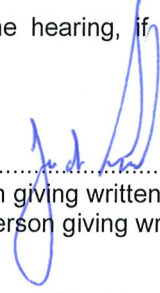

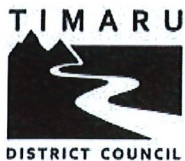

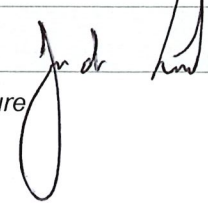

SEADOWN DRAIN AND STOPBANK PROJECT

The Department of Conservation (DOC) provides this letter to record its support in principle for the flood protection and drainage works proposed by Environment Canterbury (ECAN) that affect areas of public conservation land adjoining the Waitarakao Lagoon, as outlined in the information supplied to DOC titled *Department of Conservation Key Points* and the email you sent on 16 April 2026.

The proposed works form part of a wider integrated flood and coastal inundation management project intended to protect regional infrastructure, manage freshwater and coastal flooding risk, and improve long-term environmental outcomes. DOC recognises the strategic importance of these objectives and the effort taken by ECAN to consider effects on conservation land during project development.

Nature and location of works on conservation land

Based on the information provided, DOC notes that:

- No construction works are proposed on or seaward of the existing coastal stopbank, with the exception of limited topping-up and maintenance works to a short inland-angled section of the existing stopbank located within DOC land.
- No works are proposed within the active Waitarakao Lagoon or lagoon margins.
- A new coastal stopbank is proposed approximately 50 metres inland of the existing stopbank, extending into the northern end of the conservation land before terminating in a manner that maintains drainage functionality and avoids trapping overtopping waters.
- A new drain alignment is proposed inland of the coastal stopbank, traversing public conservation land, with design features intended to improve hydraulic performance while retaining connectivity to existing drainage and the lagoon.

DOC also notes the proposed approach to staged construction, offline excavation of the new drain to minimise sediment effects, retention of the existing lagoon outlet, and provision for native riparian and wetland planting.

Environmental considerations

DOC acknowledges the following aspects of the proposal as positive from a conservation management perspective:

- Retention of existing lagoon connection points and opportunities for fish passage and temporary habitat use during transitional phases of the project.

- Provision for at least 2 hectares of native planting, including riparian berms, benches and low-lying wetland areas, using species suited to short-term inundation.
- Measures to reduce vehicle access into conservation land and wildlife refuge areas, including revised access management at Aorangi Road and controlled maintenance access.
- Design intent to minimise long-term disturbance to coastal processes and avoid active management of the existing stopbank beyond the identified limited works.

DOC further acknowledges the broader environmental benefits associated with the inland flood protection bund, including reduced risk of contaminant discharges from industrial areas during extreme flood events.

Important clarification – a DOC Concession will be required

This letter constitutes support in principle only for the proposal as described.

It does not provide authorisation for ECAN to occupy, access, or undertake works on public conservation land.

Any works, access, occupation, structures, or ongoing maintenance activities within public conservation land will require formal authorisation by way of a concession under the Conservation Act 1987. ECAN will need to apply separately for such authorisation, and that process will include further assessment of effects, conditions, and statutory decision-making by DOC.

DOC's support expressed in this letter should not be treated as predetermining the outcome of any future concession application.

Conclusion

Subject to the matters outlined above, DOC supports the inclusion of this letter as part of ECAN's Resource Consent application to demonstrate engagement with the Department and acknowledgment of conservation land considerations. DOC considers the proposal, as described, to be generally consistent with flood risk management objectives and capable of being managed alongside conservation outcomes through appropriate statutory processes.

DOC looks forward to continued engagement with ECAN as the project progresses and, in due course, through the concession application process.

Hi Chris

Thanks for sharing the detailed information and design material — we appreciate the engagement and the work that's gone into progressing the Washdyke stopbank and drain realignment project.

We can see that the proposed works broadly align with the coastal adaptation outcomes that have previously been discussed and that were relied on in our recent subdivision consents. At a high level, we understand the intent of the project and the benefits it is seeking to deliver for the wider area.

That said, at this stage Hilton Haulage is not in a position to provide formal written approval as requested. Given the nature of the works and the way the approval is framed, we need to take some further time to review the proposal in detail — including the final AEE once available — and to consider the implications for our landholdings and future rights as an affected party.

Our current position is therefore that we are supportive of the project in principle, but reserve all statutory rights in relation to the consent process.

We will continue to engage constructively with you as the application is finalised and lodged.

We will also be coordinating with Quarry Capital as a neighbouring landowner to ensure positions are aligned where appropriate.

Hi Jim

I am happy to be emailing you with a more detailed design and other information for our Washdyke Stopbank and Drain Realignment Project Consents.

We are confident the plans we intend to put forward for consent represent a great outcome for the area and for the Hilton Haulage/Quarry Capital sites.

The time has arrived for us to finally lodge the bulk of consent applications we require to undertake this work.

We hope Hilton Haulage can consider this and provide any feedback as soon as practicable. Our hope, as discussed previously, is to obtain a formal written approval in support of the project if possible. Given Quarry Capital Ltd is a separate landowner it would be ideal for the process if either they sign off on or provide their own feedback and approval also. Are you able to advise on how best to do this?

We will be seeking written approval from all directly affected parties to this proposal as we believe this is the best avenue available to support the project through the consent process.

I have attached a few documents for consideration:

1. Design drawings for stage 1 works relevant to the Hilton Haulage and Quarry Capital Sites.
2. Some further notes on elements of the design more relevant to these properties.
3. A hydraulic modelling report detailing elements of the flood risk elements of the project.
4. Written approval form x2 (note: as we are applying for consents from Environment Canterbury and Timaru District Council, we would ideally have you fill out both forms).
5. Basic details of consent activity

We are in the process of finalising our full Assessment of Environmental Effects (AEE) for the consent applications which we can send to you on completion if you feel it is required to make decisions. If there is any other detail/element of the project you would like more information on, please let us know.

Some considerations that relate to the Hilton Haulage and Quarry Capital sites are (see attached):

1. The new stopbank and drain alignments

2. Flood risk
3. The inland flood protection bund
4. The Proposed TDC stormwater attenuation pond
5. Impact on the Hilton Haulage site stormwater pond
6. The No.1 Drain
7. Other things (fencing, tracks/access, potential recovery yard site, wetland near north boundary).

We ask that you please:

8. **Distribute this to anyone who needs to see it at your end for review (within Hilton's and Quarry Capital)**
9. **Come back to me as soon as practicable with any concerns or questions to maximise our ability to address these prior to lodging the consent applications.**
10. **Support our application with a written approval.**

We need to be clear regarding a written approval that this would remove Hilton Haulage Ltd and Quarry Capital Ltd from interacting with the formal consent process. As indicated, we hope to achieve this with all the directly affected landowners within our proposal area as we believe this offers the best opportunity to assist this critical project through the consent process. We believe this is a fair approach that reflects the significant engagement we have already had with key affected parties. We will continue to communicate regularly with Hilton Haulage to ensure that aims are delivered throughout the construction and post-construction phases of the project.

Regarding timeframes, we hope to lodge consents as soon as possible which involves completion of our AEE and final discussions with affected landowners (both happening now). If you have any questions or concerns, can you get in touch asap, otherwise we would really appreciate a final response from you in the **week ending 19 April**. The deadlines are driven by tight Regional Infrastructure Funding Timeframes and other constraints and the need to keep this project moving.

Note I (and other people in our project team if relevant) am available to meet to discuss any aspect of this with yourself and/or any other representatives - should that be helpful.
