6.2 Dog Control Annual Report

Recommendation

That the Dog Control Report 2020/2021 be noted and received and that, as required by the Dog Control Act 1996, the report be publicly notified and forwarded to the Secretary for Local Government.

Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to inform the Committee and the Secretary for Local Government of the dog control activities during the period 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021.

Assessment of Significance

2 This matter is not deemed significant under the Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.

Background

Section 10A of the Dog Control Act 1996 (the Act) requires that Timaru District Council (TDC) provides specific information to the Secretary for Local Government by way of an annual report each financial year (within one month of the Council adopting this report). This report is provided to satisfy that requirement.

Discussion

- The dog control data provided in this report is similar to previous years in most respects with some small fluctuations in data as follows:
 - 4.1 The number of infringements for failure to register a dog and failure to comply with micro-chipping requirements has increased by 59 (28%) and 23 (15%) respectively. This is largely due to continued efforts by staff to target these areas of non-compliance. Prior to issuing infringements, Animal Control Officers go to considerable lengths to encourage compliance. Reminder letters are sent out, property inspections undertaken and in the case of micro-chipping, free micro-chipping clinics are offered.
 - 4.2 Wandering dog requests for service has reduced by 111 (39%), which may be attributed largely to many wandering dogs being reunited by the community through social media.
 - 4.3 Barking dog complaints have increased by 46 (10%). This could potentially be attributed to people being more stressed post COVID-19 lockdown and therefore having lower tolerance.
 - 4.4 One prosecution was taken as a result of a dog attack, and the courts found in favour of Council.
