

- IQP's **MUST** work within their competency and registration.
- 12a's are not issued in the interest of the building owner, they are issued if appropriate, i.e. the required Inspection, Maintenance and Reporting regime is complete.
- A report in lieu is NOT a right or get out of jail card. It has no legal standing and some Councils will file them as a record that the specified system is, on the day of inspection working as required, however during the year, missed inspections or a defect that has been repaired.
- A report in lieu should never be issued if the specified system remains defective Please discuss with the Territorial Authority when a clean 12a cannot be issued.
- BSSR and SSSR have been recommended by MBIE to use when inspections have been missed due to covid-19 lockdowns and restrictions check with your Council if they are accepting them.

**None** of us involved in Building Industry wish to be in the position of being involved in considering a Building "Dangerous" in event of a fire due to failure of a specified system.

Clear documentation of the compliance path of specified systems takes the guess work out of decision of compliance.

#### **Disposal of Firefighting Foams**

This is becoming more of a hot topic, so I want to provide a brief update on what the association is doing to help members in this area. As many of you know, we ran a very successful halon recovery programme over 5 years to phase out and collect some 4.5 or more tons of Halon 1211 and 1301 for safe disposal. This was done in conjunction with the Ministry for the Environment and the Environmental Protection Agency. We are working on collecting data to see whether we can offer a similar programme for the safe disposal of fire-fighting foams and possibly extinguisher powder too. I'm not yet able to give timeframes on this as considerable work and meetings are required to get a significant project like this approved. We will also be engaging with our members to determine the types and quantities that will need to be disposed of over the coming years. We are working with several key stakeholders and government departments to try and get this initiative off the ground as soon as possible.

- a) NZS4503 review: we were joined by David Prosser of the Charitable Trust who outlined the requirements and undertakings required for using the funding model that we as a group have agreed to implement.
- b) A HOFFE subgroup will meet to ensure that we progress the requirements of the Charitable Trust so we don't lose momentum.
- c) A letter has been sent to the CEO of Worksafe by FEMA with the endorsement of the FPA to discuss various issues relating to cylinder approvals, importation, improved access to fire suppression products and solutions, as well as barriers to trade. We are ever hopeful that we might get a positive response, time will tell??
- d) Concern has been raised that people are purchasing fire extinguishers both from directly and indirectly from social media sites where claims are made, yet critical information and guidance is either not available or not given. Examples have been tabled at our meetings of fire extinguishers that for various reasons don't meet the requirements of the Hazardous Substances Regulations or manufacturing standards, are due for a hydro-test yet advertised as new etc. Well intentioned people could potentially put themselves and others at risk by putting their faith in a fire extinguisher that may not work or may not be suited to the risk. Professional advice coupled with products manufactured to an accepted and approved standard is better than buying dubiously sourced products off a social media platform and gambling with people's lives and livelihoods.

## Inspectorate SIG Update

We are seeing an increasing number of projects being carried out to NZS4541:2020. The numbers will only increase if MBIE cite NZS4541:2020 in the C clauses as they propose in their current request for public submissions.

As one knows there are many changes from 2013 to 2020. One of the main areas of change has been the degree and detail to which seismic bracketing and pipe supports must be formally documented in the completion documentation. Additionally, there are changes within section 4 of the Standard which impose a need for gravity hangers and brace components to be listed. Aon is working with FPANZ on the publication of a register of listed hardware.

All of this results in a greater dearth of detail for sprinkler system designers to detail on the drawings and supporting documentation, more precise procurement by project manager, control of site activates by site supervisors, closer reading of plans by the installers, and greater cross referencing by inspectors of the for-construction drawings with what they are seeing physically installed.

By the Standard details of the hanger and bracing design only have to be provided as part of the completion documentation package. That is no different to the process of detailed sprinkler head layouts and pipe plans which are only provided at completion stage. This is predicated on the assumption that component system designers aren't making major mistakes with the processes of hydraulic calculation and general sprinkler set out, and there is little evidence of that. However, the same cannot be said for hanger and bracing design. We are unfortunately seeing examples of bracketing and bracing being poorly executed on projects and that is an alarming situation. It is in no one's interest that after a sprinkler system is installed its only when the as-built package is provided to the SSC that deep and widespread issues are discovered with the hanging and bracing system.

Our experience to date has been the more successful projects are distinguished by one key feature: early and detailed engagement by the designer with the SSC. On these jobs any wrinkles in loading calculations, hanger and bracing set out, and material selections are ironed out during the design phase. As such Aon is asking for hanger and bracing design be submitted with the initial application. This allows Aon to check and confirm the detail of the design is being completed correctly; not just the boarder design inputs such as the seismic design coefficient. The result of this early engagement is that the drawings issued to site contain all the necessary detail for the correct materials to be procured, the site installers to install the right hangers and braces at the right locations and spacings, and the inspector to confirm the physical installation matches what the designer required. These measures help reduce risk for contactors and projects.

No doubt as system designers, contractors and other parties gains familiarity and confidence with NZS4541:2020 the need for early engagement will disappear. FPANZ Getting it Right seminars are one tool for developing the knowledge and skill needed to deliver successful projects. Elsewhere in this newsletter there is information about an upcoming seminar on hanging and bracing to the 2020 edition. In the fullness of time, we will be able to revert to only presenting the broad design inputs at the application stage and leave the detailed drawing and design submission until the completion stage. But until that day arrives, I encourage designers to take advantage of early review by the SSC and any formal training opportunities that arise.

## Safety Alert – Fire Suppression System Cylinder and Manifold Monitoring

There are many ways that fire suppression systems and their components can cause severe injury, or even kill you.

Gaseous Suppression ('Gas flood') systems utilise highly pressurised cylinders and suppression agent delivery networks, with mixtures of various pressurised gases or liquids.

This article is yet another timely reminder about just one of those aspects that make fire suppression systems so dangerous to work on if



they are incorrectly installed, or if you are not fully trained and competent...

#### **Background:**

Single-zone gaseous suppression systems typically discharge the suppression agent directly from the pressurised cylinder(s) into the protected area through open pipework.

Zoned gaseous suppression systems, however, discharge the pressurised agent from the cylinder(s) into a manifold. Directional zone selection valves, under the command of a control panel, then direct the suppression agent to the zone/area with the fire.

Under normal circumstances, the cylinder(s) alone are pressurised. However, if a cylinder release valve leaks when there is no fire to trigger the opening of a directional valve, the manifold can also become pressurised.

#### Local 'near miss', Discussion, and Recommendation:

An FPANZ member recently had a situation where a cylinder released pressure into the closed manifold of a zoned gaseous suppression system, but no indication or warning was triggered. This left the system in a dangerous state, with potential for serious harm if work were to be conducted on the system following the release.

As well as being dangerous, the system performance was potentially compromised due to a drop in suppression agent quantity.

Such leakage can happen overnight, or over months, and would typically only be picked up during monthly checks of cylinder pressure. Our member was fortunate on this particular site that their client checks the cylinder pressure gauges daily.



## Safety Alert – Fire Suppression System Cylinder and Manifold Monitoring *continued...*

The remedy for this issue is to install pressure monitoring so that the suppression system control panel generates a defect signal automatically for cylinder low pressure. And, on zoned systems, to ensure that the manifold between the cylinder(s) and the zone selection valves is also monitored for any unexpected pressure rise. **FPANZ recommends, in the interests of safety, that this be done retrospectively for any installed systems.** 

This event also underlines the importance of checking cylinder pressure regularly. Cylinder release valves have been known to open spontaneously if the cylinder pressure drops too low.

#### **Summary of Lessons to take away:**

- Gaseous suppression cylinder low pressure should be monitored for defect by the suppression control panel.
- In the absence of such monitoring, cylinder pressure (gauge readings) should be checked by the client between monthly tests.
- On zoned suppression systems, ensure that the manifold between the cylinder(s) and the zone selection valves is defect monitored by the control panel for any unexpected pressure rise. If absent, install such monitoring retrospectively.
- There are many ways that fire suppression system components can cause severe injury or harm if incorrectly handled. Staff working on such systems need to be fully trained to identify these hazards and take appropriate measures to avoid them.
- Assumptions are risky and potentially dangerous. If in doubt, ask.
- If you are not trained in the installation or servicing of the specific system you are asked to work on, then do not work on it and seek advice.
- The FPA Code of Practice for Gaseous Suppression Systems should be reviewed by all staff working on such systems.
- Training on fire suppression systems is specific and varies from manufacturer to manufacturer.

## SPRINKLER SEISMIC SYSTEMS Get it Right Seminar



We resume our Get it right Sprinkler Seminar series that were cut short by lockdown restrictions. This new series is driven by the ongoing changes we face as an industry and the importance of selecting the right products to meet the seismic design and installation requirements of NZS4541:202.

FPANZ is running a series of half day workshops throughout the country – our aim is to ensure that the industry is continuing to get the latest information and support. These half day workshops will focus on the seismic bracing of sprinkler systems, their components and associated approved hardware. We will be you showing examples that do not meet the requirements of NZS4541:2020. There will be an emphasis on the need to plan and install seismic bracing that meets the requirements of these standards.

The workshops will not work through how to calculate loads and select components – it is more on the emphasis on why and when to do so. A follow-up seminar will refresh how to calculate in the near future.

NZS4541:2020 was published in March 2020 and places much greater emphasis on new seismic resilience requirements of the standard.

The changes to the seismic provisions are ground-breaking, and require a new approach to how the designs are carried out, documented, and installed. These half day will be interactive and there will be lots of ability to ask questions and to participate in discussing solutions and problems in the seismic areas of sprinkler systems under the new standard. We strongly encourage the attendance of site supervisory staff who will benefit from this seminar.

#### **EARTHQUAKES**

Following recent earthquakes events in NZ (Christchurch and Kaikoura) the building industry is facing increasing pressure to design to protect the building and occupants against earthquake damage.

Generally, sprinkler systems have performed admirably in these events, however there has been some criticism of how we are designing our seismic bracing systems. The playing field has changed, and the construction sector is expecting more from the fire industry.

The presenters will outline what will now be expected to ensure that systems can be certified as compliant with the new provisions of the standards.


