TUIA MAYORAL MENTORSHIP SCHEME

Applications are now open for a new leadership
development opportunity for rangatahi Maori.
The Tuia programme is an intentional, long
term, intergenerational approach to develop the
leadership capacity of young Maori in communities
throughout New Zealand.
Mayor Nigel Bowen will be mentoring the successful
candidate on a one-to-one basis, to encourage
and enhance leadership skills. It is envisaged the

rangatahi (young person) will be mentored on a
monthly basis, involving both informal meetings and
formal occasions that will assist the young person's
development as a local leader.
The relationship also provides both partners with
the opportunity to gain a deeper insight into inter-
generational issues, cultural values and experiences.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF CENTRAL TIMARU STREETS

Pursuant to the Transport (Vehicular Traffic Road Closure) Regulations 1965, notice is hereby given that the
Timaru District Council and the New Zealand Transport Agency, for the purpose of permitting the holding
of the Timaru Christmas Parade, will close the following streets to ordinary vehicular traffic for the period
indicated hereunder.

- Stafford Street:** Heaton Street to North Street
- Turnbull Street**
- Sunday, 6 December 2020 from 2.00pm to 3.00pm
Parade Bay / Port Closure
- The Bay Hill**
- The Terrace**
- Strathallan Street:** The Terrace to Station Street
- Station Street**
- Sefton Street East - State Highway 78**
- Port Loop Road - State Highway 78 (Stafford Street / The Bay Hill to Marine Parade)**
- An alternative route to the Port from State Highway One will be signposted via Heaton Street.

It will be an offence under the above Regulations for any person other than under authority of an authorised
permit to use the streets for ordinary vehicular traffic during the periods of proposed temporary closure.
