2 Public Forum

Rhys Taylor, Kate Elsen and Sarah Johnson spoke to the Board of the activities of the Geraldine Academy of Performance & Arts and sought support from the Community Board in addressing potential concerns of their current venue. The hall utilised by the Geraldine Academy is owned by St. Mary's Anglican Church (The Church Property Trustees). The Church is facing an ever increasing financial burden of its building stock that the Academy is concerned the Church may wish to dispose of the building from their ownership. The Academy currently has a 1 year Permit to Occupy with the Church.

The Academy provides a venue for a wide variety of arts such as: Calligraphy, digital photography, children's choir, Morris Dancing, Salsa dancing, special needs singing, yoga, breakdancing, community choir, poetry and blackboard concerts; as well as hosting visiting artists and performers.

Ideally the Academy would like to stay in the building they currently occupy and hoped that there would be enough public support & funding for the building to be purchased. They are aware of the increasing cost of maintenance on the building but are unaware of any serious structural issues.

8.1 Talbot Forest Working Group Meeting Notes

The Oliver Drylands Reserve had been flood damaged from the floods earlier this year but was limited mainly to the access road. It experienced loss of habitat & species but is recovering and is better now than what it was just after the floods.

8.2 Economic Report & Geraldine Tourism Product Development

Nigel Davenport from Venture Timaru spoke to the Community Board on the general economic wellbeing of the District.

Timaru District has fared better than 95% of the country with approximately 70% of our workforce still working through the lockdown. Nationally was about 40%. Supply chain disruptions are starting to have an impact where producers need to get their product off the farm and out to the market. A shortage of Refrigerated Shipping Containers (reefers) and the general global shipping issues have highlighted New Zealand's plight of being a very small market yet the demand for New Zealand products is very high. The South Canterbury region produces enough food to feed 40M people annually with several very large food producers such as Fonterra and DB Draught Brewery located in the Region. There is concern that if the bigger industry members cannot maintain their supply chain, it may force the producers to rethink their position in the Regions and viability. Such changes would have a flow on effect for a wide range of facets in the Region. The economic world is changing; where importers would import sufficient stock as required (Just in Time model), further stockpiling may be considered to counter the increasing cost of shipping.

Timaru District is very well placed as a receiving hub for imports due to the Districts central location and suitable road, rail and shipping network.

Coastal shipping had been identified as a concern that has been raised with central Government with an emphasis on spoke and hub shipping models; where goods are shipped from smaller ports such as Timaru to larger ports such as Tauranga, transferred to a larger international vessel for distribution to the international market.

The food producers spoken to, are supportive of the Councils stance on the Three Water Reform, citing good quality water and infrastructure is critical for food production and a big influence on where food producers seek to establish their facilities.

Venture Timaru became the Regional Tourism Organisation and as such became responsible for the Geraldine Information Centre. The conditions under which the contract with the existing provider, signed in 2017 have changed and no longer fit in with the current coronavirus environment, therefore the contract will end at the end of 2021 with a new operator beginning January 2022. The Expressions of Interest is now open and a decision will be made by Venture Timaru early in November. There was general discussion on the issues that Board members had identified with the current arrangement; namely staffing knowledge, lack of hours & lack of afterhours options.

Di Hay from Venture Timaru spoke to the Community Board on the Tourism Support Reset & Recover fund to develop additional or support existing visitor ventures within the Geraldine area. A fund of \$45k has been allocated to the Geraldine area for the next 12-18 months for projects.

8.3 Update on Geraldine Stormwater Management Plan & Serpentine Creek Rehabilitation

The Stormwater Specialist and Drainage & Water Manager spoke to the Community Board to update the Board on the Stormwater Management Plan and the Serpentine Creek Rehabilitation Project

The Drainage & Water Unit are conducting 5 Stormwater Management Plans within the District, however Geraldine's Stormwater Management Plan is further along than the others as the Resource Consent has already been applied for. The Unit are continuing to seek community engagement and consultation with the public.

Baseline studies conducted on the Waihi River identified contaminants from heavy metals such as copper & zinc. The cumulative effect of the stormwater on the groundwater is such that water bores downstream may start having issues of contamination. Finding the source of contamination of ground water is challenging. The treatment of stormwater prior to entry into the ground include systems such as raingardens or sand filters to filter the contaminants prior to the water reaching the network or groundwater.

The Serpentine Creek in Geraldine was inherited by Timaru District Council and was found to have several challenges. As sections of the creek were on private land maintenance had been an issue and owners maintenance varied. Timaru District Council apponted CityCare to clear the creek of overgrowth and rehabilitate sections where issues had been identified. The clearing of the Serpentine Creek should help relieve the stormwater network, however issues such as South Terrace Road lay in another catchment which is not directly attributed to the Serpentine.
