SUBMITTING TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLANS

Timaru District TMP minimum processing timeframes, from when TDC receives a submitted TMP.


Work Type	Timeframe
Minor works	5 working days
Major works	15 working days
Generic/global TMP	15 working days
Roadworks requiring public notification	15 working days (prior to public notification requirements needing to be undertaken)
Event TMP where a road closure is required	90 Days see Road Closures for Events

RISK BASED TMPs: OUR APPROACH

Our transition to risk based TMPs is almost at Phase Two.


During the Progressive Implementation phase, we're accepting risk based TTM and will continue to refine processes from previous trials.

Phase Two will continue until the end of June 2027.

Local Operating Practice update - MyWay bus route notification



ECan have recently advised that there are over 2000 MyWay stops within the Timaru and Temuka townships. These stops are not “marked” bus stops, but are designated MyWay pick up/drop off points.

Every TMP entry for Timaru and Temuka will require notification to ECan of upcoming works
