**Resource Consent No. 102.2018.78
Section 92 Request for Further Information
Construct and Use Helipad
14-16 Queen Street, Parkside, Timaru**

Timaru District Council has reviewed your resource consent application and pursuant to section 92(1) of the Resource Management Act 1991 (the Act), requests the following further information in respect of the application:

1. Please provide a record of helicopter movements to the Hospital for the last five years. This shall include providing a record of night time (10pm-7am) helicopter movements so that effects of sleep disturbance can be sufficiently assessed.
2. As recommended in the peer review of the acoustic report please investigate measures to mitigate the effects of sleep disturbance on properties to the east of the proposed helipad. This should include an investigation into the option of providing a noise barrier adjacent to the helipad and also treating individual household units.
3. Please advise if it is the intension to reinstate the vehicle crossing adjacent to the proposed helipad to kerb and channel outlet.
4. Please advise if it is the intension to comply with Part D2, Section 2.6.1, Rule 5.17-5.18 of the District Plan which relate to lighting.

The provision of the above information will help the consent authority to better understand the proposed activity, its effect on the environment and the way any adverse effects on the environment might be avoided, remedied or mitigated.

In accordance with section 92A of the Act you must within 15 working days of the date of this request, take one of the following options:

- provide the information; or
- inform the consent authority in writing that you agree to provide the information;
or
- inform the consent authority in writing that you refuse to provide the information.

If you agree to provide the information Council will subsequently set a reasonable time within which the information must be provided and inform you of this date in writing. Please note that failure to provide the information requested or failure to comply with the time limit could result in your application being publically notified or declined.

In accordance with section 88C of the Act, the processing of your application will be placed on hold until:

- we have received the requested information; or
- we have received confirmation that you do not intend to provide the information; or
- the time limit Council has set has lapsed.
