## SEWERMAIN RENEWAL

### Contract 2447 – Talbot Street Sewermain Renewal (Kennedy Street to Huffey Street)

As part of the infrastructure renewal programme, Timaru District Council have awarded Paul Smith Earthmoving Ltd the contract to renew 600m of existing sewermain along Talbot Street from Kennedy Street to Huffey Street, Geraldine.

The construction is programmed to start on 10 August 2020 and anticipated to be completed by September 2020.

During the construction period, traffic disruption will occur but will be minimized and managed thru traffic management plan.

After the completion of this project, Talbot Street from Kennedy Street to Huffey Street is programmed to be reconstructed in 2022. This is to ensure sufficient period to identify any defects that could occur by the sewermain project has been rectified prior to the road reconstruction.
