PLUMBSOLVENCY

DRINKING WATER STANDARDS

Each year, as part of the Ministry of Health requirements, we are required to remind you that some plumbing fittings have the potential to dissolve and release very tiny traces of metal into the water which has been in domestic taps and pipes for several hours eg - overnight, when you've been away on holiday or at your holiday home.

Even though the health risk is small the Ministry of Health guidelines recommend that the first mug full of water each day is not drunk

but, for example, is used to water plants etc as this will remove the traces of metal from the water. We recommend this simple precaution to all households, whether you are on public or private supply.

SEWERMAIN RENEWAL

Contract 2488 - Beverley Hill and **Peel Street Sewermain Renewal**

As a part of Infrastructure Renewal program, Timaru District Council have engaged Rooney Earthmoving Ltd to renew the existing Sewermains along Beverley Hill, Timaru and Peel Street. Geraldine.

The works have started at Beverley hill and anticipated to be complete by 16 July 2021. The extent of work is from Beverley Road intersection to Wai-iti Road intersection.

The works at Peel Street, Geraldine are expected to start mid-June and anticipated to be complete by end of July. Contractor shall send out the notification to advise of the exact dates. The extent of works is from Hislop Street Intersection upto the Running Duck café.

During the construction period, traffic and pedestrian disruption will occur but will be minimised with the use of appropriate Traffic Management.

DOG REGISTRATION

Do I need to register my dog?

Yes, all dogs over the age of three months old need to be registered with the Council.

It is important to keep all your details and your dog's details on our register and the national register. Please let the Council know, within 14 days, if your dog dies, you sell or give it away, or you change your address.

You can now register online

If your dog is already registered, you can now renew your dog registration online by visiting www.timaru.govt.nz/pay-online

New dogs need to be registered separately by visiting a Council office or service centre.

What happens if I don't register my dog?

- You will have to pay your dog registration fee plus an additional late payment fee.
- When an unregistered dog is found the owner can be liable for a \$300 infringement.
- The dog can be seized and impounded.
