

Business Group Purpose

The Land Transport is responsible for the operation, management, maintenance and improvement of the Timaru District road network and transport facilities.

- Activity management planning;
- Preparation of business cases;
- Policy analysis and review;
- District Plan and bylaw review; and
- Submissions preparation.
